## **Year of Saint Joseph**

In the Year of St. Joseph, we want to learn what we can about this quiet, unassuming man so that we can better understand his relationship to our Lord, Jesus Christ and to us.

St. Joseph is a figure in the canonical gospels of Matthew and Luke. He was married to Mary, the mother of Jesus, and was the legal father of Jesus. St. Joseph is venerated as a saint in many Christian churches today.

Joseph was by birth of the royal family of David but lived in humble obscurity as a "carpenter." Carpenter meant many things in those days. He may have built tables and chairs for homes. He may have been a mason or stone cutter/worker. He was undoubtedly known in his community as a skilled craftsman. Joseph (and his son Jesus) were probably the ones to go to in the village when setting the foundation of a house or building, or building a functional door or doorway. Joseph would have been a frequent sight in their town, helping others with their projects.

Joseph was betrothed to Mary, a young girl, when God raised him to the highest sanctity and called him to be the spouse of His Virgin Mother, and foster father and guardian of Jesus, the Incarnate Word. Using dreams, God called Joseph, in the face of severe humiliation, as Mary was pregnant through the Holy Spirit, to marry his betrothed. Joseph could have divorced Mary but Joseph did the right thing because God called upon him to do so. He protected Mary and the unborn Child, demonstrating his true nature and his trust in God.
