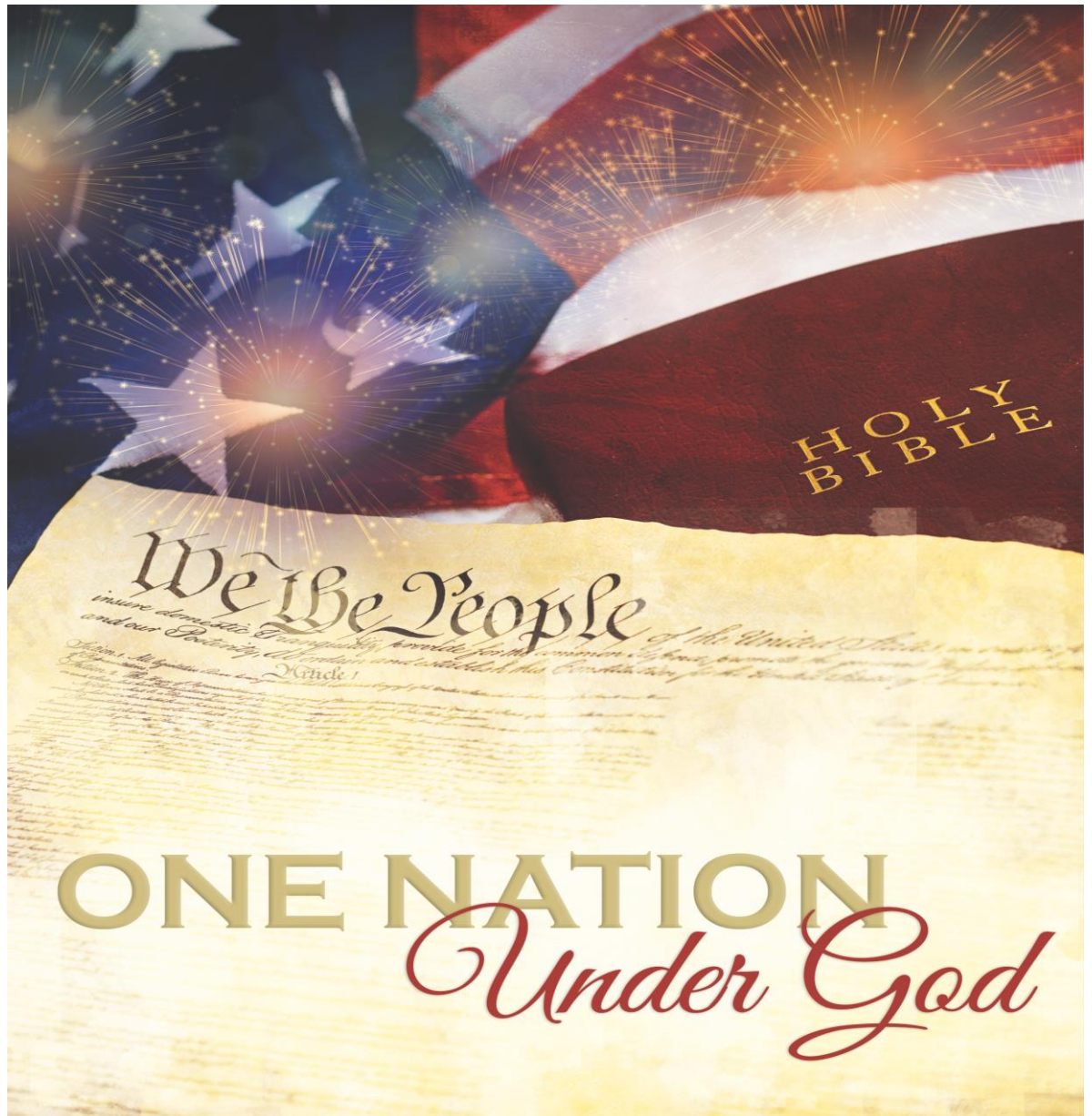

Year of Saint Joseph

What do we surmise about Joseph's relationship with his foster son, Jesus? We believe that Joseph raised Jesus as his own son, cared for him, provided for him, put a roof over Jesus's head. We believe that Joseph and Mary would have taught Jesus to honor the family and to contribute to the family's wellbeing. We believe that Joseph also taught Jesus his craft of building. This would have been the natural thing to do at that time. Parents were their children's teachers in the matter of making a living, of understanding and building faith in the one true God, and of following the laws of the land and of being a good citizen.

Pope Francis tells us that Joseph teaches us "the value, the dignity, and the joy of what it means to eat bread that is the fruit of one's own labor." This speaks to the value of work and teaches us to appreciate the importance of dignified work, of which Joseph is an exemplary model.

St. Joseph is very much needed in our modern times. He is an inspiration for good fatherhood, for nurturing and caring for the family, and for hard work done with honor and integrity. Praying for St. Joseph's intercession in today's troubled world is a worthy action for us as Catholics. Pray that families will be healed, that fathers and mothers will take on the role of parenthood with determination, faith, and love. Pray that fathers and mothers will teach their children about the role of work in our society, of contributing to the world through the dignity of work. Pray that families who are separated may help their children to know that they are loved by both parents and that the family must be cared for and nurtured as St. Joseph did with the Holy Family. St Joseph, pray for our families this day.
