

inspire all of us to study and live the Word of God.


Welcome Our Mission Statement

Pick Up Your Free Book

During this Diocesan year of the Eucharistic Revival in our country we are called to enter into a closer relationship with God and evangelize others as we renew our focus on Christ's true presence in the Eucharist. On a recommendation from Daniel Maul, Diocesan director of Evangelization and recent speaker at Holy Rosary, Father Ed has purchased the book **"Becoming Eucharistic People"** by Timothy P. O'Malley. He is encouraging each family to take a book home to read and study. Various parish

Kennedi Lewellyn will be traveling to Panama this March to facilitate medical, dental, and public health tasks with WVU and fellow students. Over the course of the brigades, students will work with medical and dental professionals to provide

medical and dental care to patients. Students will also be tasked with public health initiatives, assisting local masons and artisans in the construction of septic tanks, washing stations, biodigesters, and the mixing and laying of concrete flooring. This work requires many donations as they are providing free care to the under resourced communities in Panama.
