
Baptism~ Please call the parish office to schedule an appointment for baptism preparation.

Easter Message from the Pastor



For us Catholics and other Christian denominations, Easter is the greatest feast of all feasts. No wonder the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: “Therefore Easter is not simply one

feast among others, but the ‘feast of feasts,’ the ‘Solemnity of solemnities,’ just as the Eucharist is the “Sacrament of Sacraments’ (#1169.p.303). St Athanasius the Great calls Easter “the Great Sunday.”

At Easter, we commemorate Christ’s victory over death on the Holy Cross and his resurrection from death. St. Paul gives us the oldest summary of our Christian belief with regard to Easter: “I (Paul) handed on to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; that he was buried; that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures; that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve...so we preach and so you believed.” (1 Cor 15:3-5,11). He went on to remind us, “If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins” (1 Cor 15:17). Thanks be to God for raising his beloved Son Jesus Christ from death which teaches us that for Christians, death is not the end of life but a transition to a new and better life with Jesus and his heavenly Father.

I would like to take this opportunity to register my profound thanks and appreciation to the Parish staff, liturgy committee, cantors, organists, lectors, sacristans, and everyone who made our Lenten and Easter celebrations a memorable one.

May our risen Lord Jesus Christ bless you and your loved ones for your dedication to his Church and mission.

At Easter, we celebrate that our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, conquered

death, rose from the dead, and remains very much alive. To the world of non-believers: what!? It is quite a big reality to swallow. But for the believer, it is a reality that inspires us to the point where we find ourselves constantly sharing the Gospel with everyone we meet! Right?

So what does Easter mean to you? The question is not what do you believe. The question is what impact does Easter have on you? How do your actions demonstrate the power of Easter? What does it mean we you hear that we, the Church, are an Easter people?

You may be saying right now that you have no intention of becoming an evangelist, passing out Bibles to all you meet. But I would like to suggest that you actually have a more powerful way of evangelizing others: everyday stewardship. Actions speak louder than words and the way you live your life can be a great testimony to all those you encounter. By acknowledging the gifts you have been given, cultivating those so they grow to an increase, and then sharing them fully with God and with others in God's name will give testimony to your belief that Jesus is alive and seeking a relationship with each of his people.

If more of us won't live our lives in this manner, then non-believers and non-intentional disciples will ask the question, "What difference does Easter make anyway?" Jesus died and rose for you and me. To be sure, it DOES make a difference.
