At Mass we are called to be like Jesus, by loving and serving one another in the world.


As I become more like Him, please continue to help me.

If you had to summarize the essential core of the Christian life, what would it be? Mercy, truth, or love, perhaps? The readings today suggest another word which may surprise you.



That word is priesthood. St. Peter says to us, "You are a 'chosen race, a royal priesthood..."

be part of a priesthood is to offer a particular sacrifice in order

for the community to survive and thrive. Jesus is the great high priest because he offers the one perfect sacrifice which heals and perfects the entire human race. Peter the Apostle wants us to know that all the baptized share in this priestly ministry.
