Blessing of Throats Next Week

Why do we bless our throats? "One reason for St. Blaise's popularity arose from the fact he was a physician who cured, even performing miraculous cures. Thereby, those who were sick, especially with throat ailments, invoked his intercession. Eventually the custom of the blessing of throats arose, whereby the priest held two crossed candles over the heads of the faithful or touched their throats with them while he invoked the prayer of the saint and imparted God's blessing. In our present Roman Ritual, the priest prays, "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." This practice continues in many parishes on St. feast day." (Fr. Bill Saunders, Catholic Research Center) In honor of St. Blaise, we will bless throats next weekend after each liturgy, February 4 and 5. Please come up to the front immediately after the liturgy.

World Day of the Sick and the Sacrament of the Sick

World Day of the Sick is a Catholic Church awareness day, or observance, on February 11, aimed at praying and sharing, sacrificing one's suffering for the welfare of the church, and urging everyone to see the face of Christ in his or her ailing brother or sister. The day falls on the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, and it is an important occasion for individuals in the Catholic health ministry to reflect on caring for those who are sick as well as those who care for them.

Pray for the sick

Say a prayer for those who are sick. They need all the help you can offer, and your prayers can go a long way.

Offer support to the sick

Interested individuals and organizations can also provide the sick with food, medication, and other supplies. Volunteering at a local health center is another excellent way to participate.

Appreciate healthcare workers

The World Day of the Sick also serves as an occasion to honor the work of healthcare professionals, hospital chaplains, and all those who help the sick. Encourage them and show them that their efforts are appreciated.

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is offered to those who are afflicted with serious illness or who are about to undergo potentially dangerous or risky medical procedures. The Sacrament prays for physical healing as well as forgiveness of sins. The sacrament of the sick will be administered to any individual after each mass on February 11 and 12. Please come forward to be anointed immediately after mass.

World Day of Marriage

The observances of National Marriage Week (Feb. 7-14) and World Marriage Day (Sunday, Feb. 12) are an opportunity to focus on building a culture of life and love that begins with supporting and promoting marriage and the family. This year's theme, "Marriage...one flesh, given and received" highlights the one-flesh union of husband and wife that is willed by God. It also indicates the personal self-gift of each spouse, one to the other. (USCCB) At Holy Rosary Parish, we will celebrate all marriages with a special blessing and sharing of a delicious wedding cake surprise after each mass on February 18 and 19. This collection benefits the Church in Latin America, The Church in Central and Eastern Europe, and the Church in Africa. An Invitation~Hands and Hearts for Christ

Hands and Hearts for Christ is a group of dedicated individuals that travel yearly to Central America to perform medical, surgical, and dental procedures on those that otherwise would not get needed medical and dental care. Except during the height of Covid, this group has traveled to Belize and Guatamala since 1999. I have been traveling with them as a recovery room nurse since 2013. Our next trip is March 11-19, 2023 to Antigua, Guatamala.

This year our group is approximately 50 care-givers. The surgical team mainly performs laparoscopic gall bladder removals, hernia repairs and cyst and lypoma removals on children and adults. We also have done a few other procedures if we have the proper equipment. We average 80-125 surgical procedures in our week abroad. The dental team performs 150-225 procedures.

In order to accomplish this, we work all year, collecting medical supplies and raising funds. We bring all of our own supplies and instruments and pay for our own travel, housing, food and the cost of transporting our supplies to Central America. I would like to invite my parish family to be the body of Christ with us as we travel to do what Christ has called us to do. Although all roles are filled for this year, we always need volunteers to come with us. (I have trained an elementary school cook and a hotel receptionist to be recovery room technicians.) We also need volunteers to help raise the funds to support our missions. I can be contacted at our church (I usually attend the Saturday evening mass), or via email bonzohibbs@yahoo.com.
