

### Pastoral Council October Meeting Summary

Here's the October meeting summary of your Pastoral Council:

1. Updates on facilities: parish center boiler system is up and running. Offices for the secretary, youth/family minister, and Brother Roy are operational. The garage was painted, as were areas of Marist Hall, the back area of the church, and around the parish grounds. Patio repair at the rectory is under way, as are repairs to the rectory driveway by the Knights of Columbus.
2. Census: The response to the census update forms was about 58% of the parish. The remainder of parishioners will be contacted by mail.
3. Data Analysis: An attendance and collection analysis of the last five years was examined. Attendance is up by 3% so far this year compared to last year, and the collection is up 13% this year.
4. Spiritual Growth: Personal and parish spiritual growth is one of the most important hallmarks of a growing parish community. The members of the council were invited to share how they believe they have grown in their spiritual life. Has our Holy Rosary church helped them to grow spiritually? The council members will ask parishioners to share how our Holy Rosary parish has helped them to grow in their prayer and spiritual life. (No names will be mentioned.)
