Baptism~ Please call the parish office to schedule an appointment for baptism preparation.

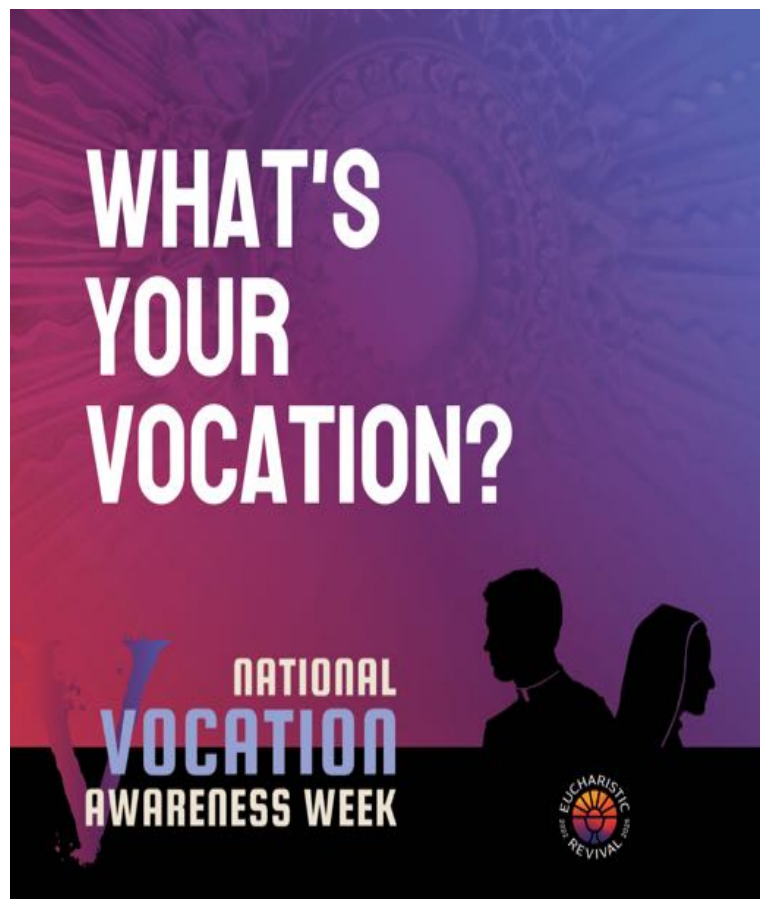
Marriage~ Please call the parish office at least six months before you schedule a wedding.

RCIA IS CHANGING!

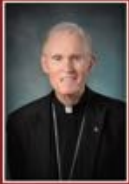

A Gentle Reminder: Self- Care
