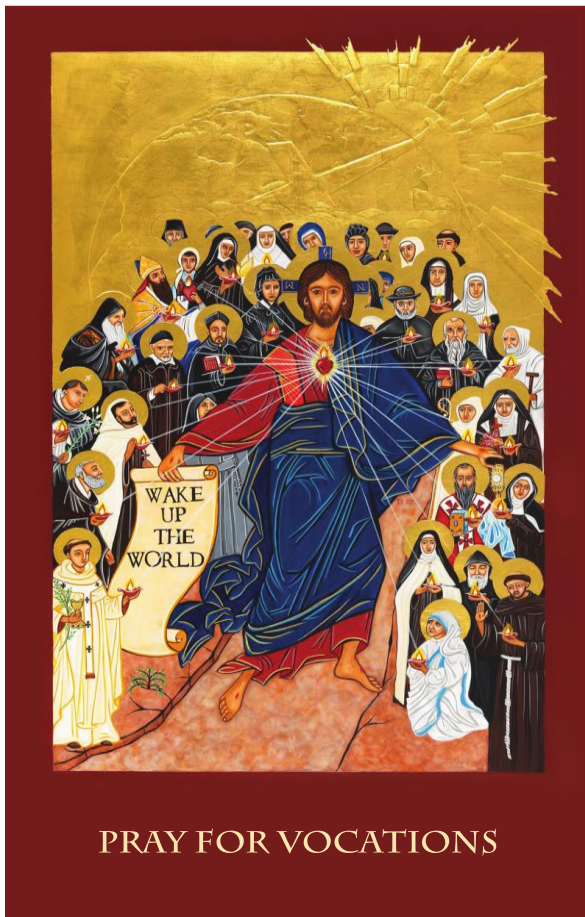

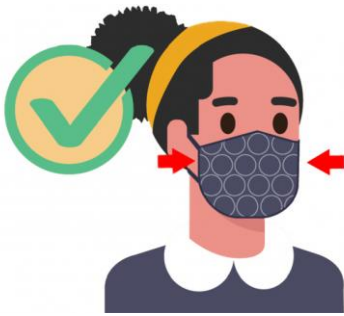
Ash Wednesday

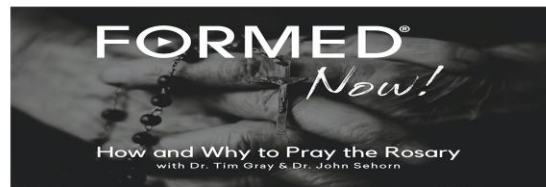

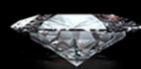
